Welcome to Concert Choir, and congratulations on being accepted into this auditioned ensemble at Bernards High School! You should be proud of your accomplishments. Concert Choir is at the core of the choral experience at BHS; it is the largest choral ensemble in the school as it consists of students from four different class periods. Although the class is split into multiple sections, the sections work as one ensemble in performance.

Goals

In the beginning of the school year, we will set goals, both long and short-term, that we would like to attain throughout the year. It is expected that all of us (including me!) will do our very best each and every day to attain our goals.

Daily Expectations

- Please don't be late for class. Out of respect for your peers and teacher, you should be on time every day.
- In order to be creative with riser placement and unique singing configurations, please
 don't bring your backpacks and non-choir materials up to the risers with you.
 Backpacks will go off to the side of the classroom in a designated area (this will be
 different than in the past).
- Always be prepared for class and work to achieve the class goals to the best of your ability.

Materials

- Pencils You must keep one pencil in your folder at all times.
- Folder Folders are provided by the school. Your folder is property of Bernards High School and must be kept in excellent condition; if it is damaged, you will be responsible for replacing it at your own expense.
- Music Your music is kept in your choir folder. If you are bringing your music home to practice, just bring your folder home to keep the music safe. Music is property of Bernards High School and must be kept in excellent condition; if any piece is lost or damaged, you will be responsible for replacing it at your own expense. You may not keep your music.

Fund Raising

Throughout the year, students will be asked to participate in fund raising events. A portion of each student's fundraising efforts will go directly into their own Bernards Choir account. From this account, students will have the opportunity to apply their funds toward the cost of concert attire ordered through the school, field trips, and other Bernards Choir related expenses. These funds will carry-over from one school year to the next, but they cannot be transferred to another student or used for non-Bernards Choir expenses (including band or orchestra, sports, or other school expenses). Charms Office

Bernards Choir uses a cloud-based student management system called Charms Office. Charms Office is used to calculate, organize, and track student fund-raising and payments, assist with parent and student communication, help students to practice their music at home, and provides several other powerful back-end tools. In the beginning of the year, each student will receive a personal account log-in and password and will be able to login through the parent/student portal. Parent Volunteers

There are times when it is necessary to have parent volunteers assist with events. These duties will range from chaperoning trips, baking for a concert reception, to assisting with social choral events. Before an event, an e-mail will be sent to all families requesting volunteers. If you are available to volunteer, please reply to the e-mail with the information that is requested. It is important to have many parents volunteer so that we are not relying on the same parents to assist with every event. Parents should plan to assist in some capacity for at least one event each year.

Student Leadership Roles

Students will have the opportunity to fill various leadership positions during the school year. Positions may include, but are not limited to, Section Leaders, Social Event Coordinators, and Fundraising Assistants. Students involved in these positions will meet as necessary in the planning and implementation of their duties. Some positions will be open to students in any ensemble while others will be restricted to members of specific ensembles.

Home Practice

Just as you are expected to complete homework assignments in other classes, you are expected to practice your music at home. As a member of Concert Choir, you should do your best to learn all assigned sections of music by any given date throughout the school year. If you do not have the ability to learn the music on your own, please be sure to ask for extra help from a peer or your teacher! There are many of us willing and able to help you out. Practice files will often be posted on the class webpage, and you are expected to use them to your advantage. You may take your music and folder home on any night; however, you are required to have your folder and your music during every class period. Any assignment that you are given must be completed on time for full credit. Make-up assignments or bonus points are never given.

Hearings (Music Testing)

Being part of an auditioned ensemble requires you to learn your music quickly and efficiently. Any section of music that was learned in class can be tested at any time. A "Hearing" is an opportunity for Mr. LaPine to "hear" you in performance of the selected repertoire. Typically, you will receive plenty of notice before a Hearing will take place; however, a Hearing can happen at any time. Hearings may be memorized or un-memorized, but all Hearings will be recorded live in class using your smart phone. Be sure to have a recorder app such as "Voice Memos" on an iPhone or "Voice Recorder" on an Android phone, both are free apps.

Dress Rehearsals and Performances

You are required to attend and be a positive participant in every dress rehearsal and performance. As a positive participant you will be on time, focused on the task at hand, work to the best of your ability, be fully prepared, and do everything that is asked of you. You should never distract from the rehearsal or performance. Your participation should have a positive impact on the musicians around you and the rehearsal or performance as a whole. All dress rehearsals and performances are mandatory, graded events (see section on Grading), and

you are expected to make them a top priority in your personal schedule. There are no excuses for missing a dress rehearsal or performance. If you miss one for any reason, except in the event of a true emergency, you will receive a "o" grade — no exceptions.

Afternoon/Evening Rehearsals

There will be afternoon and evening rehearsals in preparation for performances. This is our chance to work as an ensemble with an accompanist for a dedicated amount of time. Plenty of notice will be given for each rehearsal, and you will be notified as soon as rehearsals are scheduled. The rehearsal schedule will be released during the first full week of school. *You are expected to attend all additional evening rehearsals*. If there is an extenuating circumstance (as determined by Mr. LaPine) for which you cannot attend an evening rehearsal, a <u>written note from your parent or guardian is required well in advance</u>, which means that Mr. LaPine should be notified immediately when the conflict arises or at least one month before the rehearsal. Students will not be excused from an afternoon or evening rehearsal *without sufficient notice* except in the event of a true emergency. If there is a sudden emergency, it is your responsibility to bring a written note from your parent or guardian to Mr. LaPine the *first day that you are back in school*. If this is not done, you will receive a "o" grade for the rehearsal no exceptions.

Performance Attire

You are required to wear the appropriate Concert Choir performance attire at every performance, unless otherwise noted. If there is no mention of attire for a performance, you can assume that you will be wearing your Concert Choir performance attire. If you need to purchase the appropriate Concert Choir attire, you will have an opportunity to do so in the beginning of the school year. If you are not in the correct attire for a performance you will not perform, and your grade will reflect this as a missed performance.

When performing as a member of Concert Choir, it is expected that all long hair will be up and/or back and away from your face. There should be **no visible jewelry**, including, but not limited to, visible bracelets (this includes <u>all</u> bracelets), rings, necklaces, and large earrings (small, tasteful earrings may be worn). At the end of the school year, boys who borrowed tuxedo pants and coat will be required to have them dry cleaned before returning them to the school.

GradingAll grades are weighted using the following percentages:

Grading Category	Weight
Daily Demonstration of Vocal Technique Based on a weekly grading system (one point per day)	40%
Hearings Based on 20-point rubric	25%
Dress Rehearsals and Performances* Based on a 7-point rubric	20%
Music Theory and Sight-Singing Based on rubric or actual given grade	15%

^{*}If there are no performances in a given marking period, the 20% weight of that category will be equally distributed.

Performances and Events

Mr. LaPine will give you a list of all performances and events in the beginning of the school year. At times, other performing opportunities may be afforded our ensemble. Since you are in Concert Choir, it is possible that your ensemble may be invited to perform at various functions and events throughout the school year in addition to the annual Winter Concert, PopsNight, Spring Concert, and the Choral Department field trip. You will be notified *immediately* when any performing engagement or rehearsal is added or modified. All additions or modifications to the performance and rehearsal schedule will be posted on the class website and announced in class. It is your responsibility to take note of any changes to the schedule.

Communication

Besides in-person communication, the primary means for communication will be via e-mail. If you need to contact Mr. LaPine for any reason, you may e-mail him at mlapine@shsd.org. If you would like to talk via phone, it is best to send an e-mail with the best phone number where you can be reached. Mr. LaPine will send regular correspondences to families via the e-mail address provided on the Student Information Sheet (attached). Students and parents should provide a regularly-checked e-mail address and phone number to be sure that you receive regular updates.
